DIVISION OF BOOKKEEPING AND WARRANTS.

SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith detailed statements of the receipts and disbursements of the Government for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1909, as follows: Ordinary receipts derived by the Government from customs, internal revenue, and sales of public lands, in each district and State, and from various miscellaneous sources, \$603,589,489.84; Panama Canal receipts—proceeds of bonds, \$30,731,008.21; and public debt receipts, \$45,624,239.50. Total receipts, \$679,944,737.55. Ordinary disbursements, \$662,324,444.77, which includes \$19,501,062.37 grants from the Treasury for deficiencies in the postal revenues; disbursements for the Panama Canal, \$31,419,442.41; and for the public debt, \$104,996,770. Total disbursements, \$798,740,657.18.

Also statements of the postal revenues amounting to \$203,562,383.07, and of the expenditures therefrom for the postal service in like sum, the deficiencies in said revenues being paid under the law by grants from the Treasury.
